I have undertaken a number of major reviews, have a number of conference publications in proceedings documents, have conducted conference-based workshops and workshops for other institutions, and publications as monographs, reports, and broadcasts.

I have 184 entries in the [Index to Chiropractic Literature](#) (as of 29th October 2020) , 6 papers in PubMed, and am cited. The citation that most satisfies me is of my papers on cryotherapy that recommended a new protocol for icing sprained ankles (C1.1 and C1.10). The foundation paper marked my debut in the index, peer-reviewed literature and the [protocol](#) published some 10 papers later stimulated new work by other authors that was [published](#) as recently as 2006. The hoopla that surrounded what I feel is my seminal paper (C1.9) was as expected, however it is still pleasant to see it cited.
